

Unique Aspects of the WOSB Federal Contract Program



Many NAICS codes are now authorized for use under the WOSB Federal Contract Program. Check <u>sba.gov/wosbready</u> for available NAICS (733).



WOSBs and EDWOSB must receive certification through WOSB.certify.sba.gov in order to be eligible to compete on set-aside and sole-source contracts.



COs must verify WOSB and EDWOSB certification on the <u>Dynamic Small Business Search</u> (DSBS) database.



Good News Stories

- A firm that was already SDVOSB but via our expedited application process also became EDWOSB certified. They received a WOSB set-aside award for ~\$6M stabilizing this small company in Atlanta and growing their workforce with new jobs!
- Fueling US Economic Impact: In FY21, over \$1.2 billion in federal procurements were set-aside for WOSB/EDWOSB firms generated 2.8x the impact for a total of over \$3.6 billion in aggregate economic activity—WOSB firms have the biggest impact to our US marketplace more than any of the other SBA set-aside programs.



Changes to Remember

- The self-certification process is no longer available in <u>certify.sba.gov</u>. All Firms seeking to participate in the program must apply via WOSB. Certify.sba.gov
- Third-party certified firms apply by submitting their TPC certificate.
- All firms seeking to participate in the WOSB Federal Contract Program, WOSB or EDWOSB set-aside contract or sole source must be certified.
- COs no longer have to verify a WOSB firm's documentation. Program participation is displayed on the firm's <u>Dynamic Small Business Search</u> (DSBS) profile.
- Women-owned small businesses that are not certified for SBA's WOSB Federal Contracting Program may continue to identify as women-owned small businesses in SAMgov and receive contract awards outside the program, and these awards can count toward an agency's goal for awards to WOSBs.



Agency Call to Action

You can increase small business' access to federal contracting opportunities through:

- 1. Become proficient about the WOSB Program.
- 2. Make larger awards to WOSB/EDWOSB firms.
- 3. Make awards to firms who hold multiple certifications.
- 4. Prioritize WOSBs from the top!
- 5. Build relationships with WOSB and EDWOSB businesses.
- 6. Plan in advance to reserve opportunities for WOSB/EDWOSB set-asides in key NAICS/industries.
- 7. Commit to making at least one more WOSB/EDWOSB award than you did last year.
- 8. Reach out to support or for more information.
